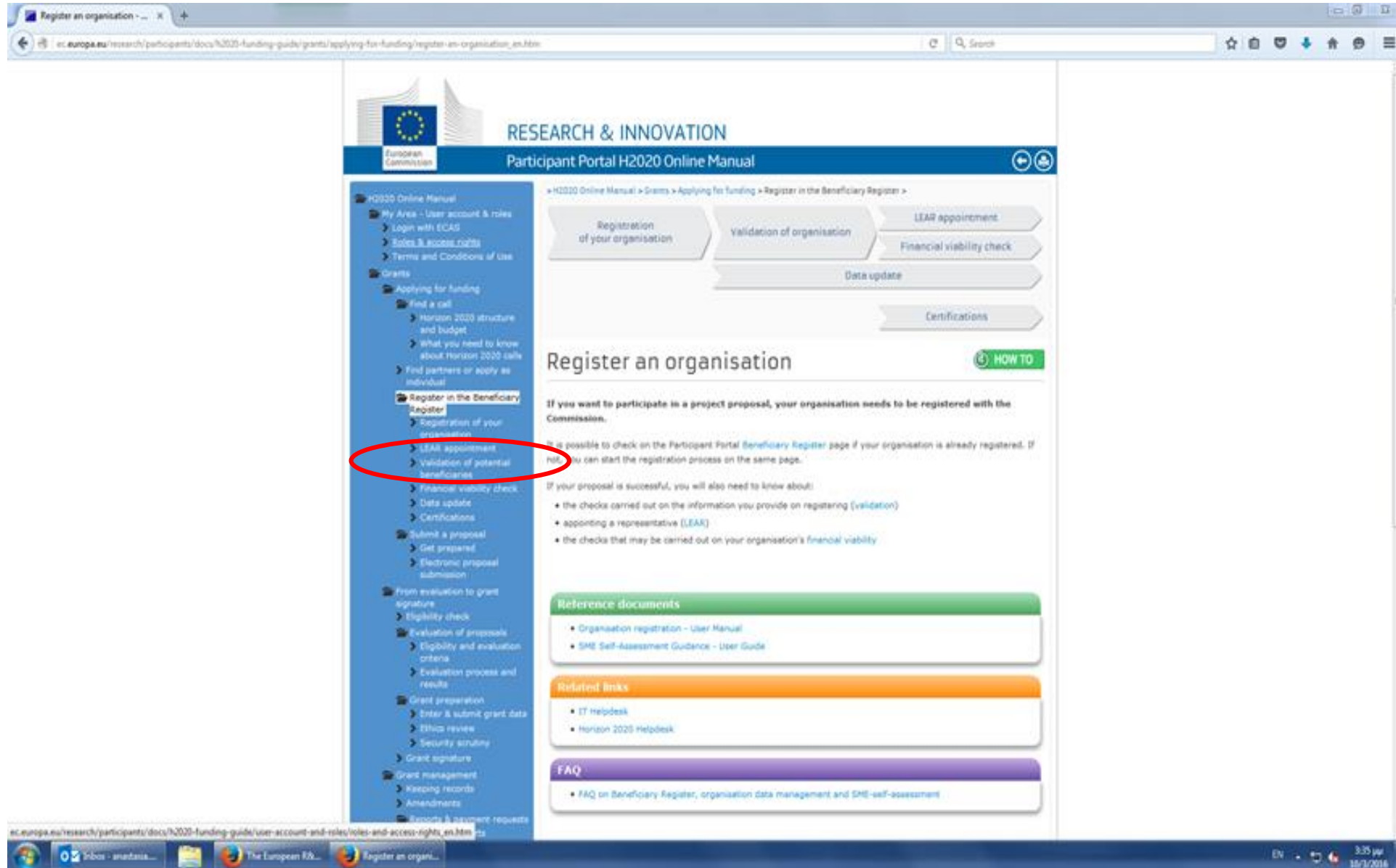

Register an organisation HOW TO

If you want to participate in a project proposal, your organisation needs to be registered with the Commission.

It is possible to check on the Participant Portal Beneficiary Register page if your organisation is already registered. If not, you can start the registration process on the same page.

If your proposal is successful, you will also need to know about:

- the checks carried out on the information you provide on registering (validation)
- appointing a representative (LEAK)
- the checks that may be carried out on your organisation's financial viability

Registration of your organisation.

- Register your organisation (provide information about its legal status and its finances)
- SME self-assessment (enter the financial figures of the last approved accounting period of your organisation)
- On completing registration, you will receive a 9-digit **Participant Identification Code (PIC)** - to be quoted in your proposal and in any correspondence with the Commission.
- Initially, the person who registered the organisation, called 'self-registrant', can submit updates and corrections (with corresponding supporting documents) on the My Organisations page of the My Area section.
- Later, this will be the task of the appointed representative **LEAR (Legal Entity Appointed Representative)** when she or he is appointed.

Most of the H2020 themes support collaborative research projects where **at least three organisations** from different countries form a consortium. However, there are a number of opportunities also for **one-participant** actions:

- European Research Council (ERC) research grants – support frontier research by individual researchers and teams.
- Marie Skłodowska-Curie actions – support researcher mobility. Besides research funding, scientists have the possibility to gain experience abroad and in the private sector.

Where to search for partners?

1. CORDIS Partner Service

European Commission's primary public repository and portal to disseminate information on all EU-funded research projects and their results. One of the largest databases of partner profiles (self-registered profiles).

CORDIS in numbers; 10497 Partner profiles, 60 Open Calls for Proposals, 5479 Partnership requests, 1324 Proposing project, 4155 Offering collaboration, 378 Groups

2. Idealist Partner Search

Developed by the ICT NCPs network. However, the partner profiles are not limited only to ICT. The service includes advice on creating your profile by your local NCP and there is a quality control of all the published data.

3. NCPs CaRE: Partner search for Societal Challenge 5 “Climate action, environment, resource efficiency and raw materials”

Within the NCPs network project “CaRE” in SC5, the partnering tool supports potential applicants for the Horizon 2020 Work programme in finding partners and building a consortium for a project proposal. The service includes:

- Partner offer - Researchers who offer their expertise in a specific topic of research and are looking for collaboration in possible project consortia
- Partner search - Researchers or consortia with a definite idea for a project looking for additional partners to complement their expertise.
- Validation of requests by a responsible National Contact Point - NCP.
